#### November Daycare Meeting

#### **November Board Meeting**

President Baysinger stated that the Buildings-Grounds Committee will meet soon to further look into the new building feasibility study.

Presented unofficial board election results. The elected board members will be announced when they become official.

Stated health and dental premiums will go up 5.5% for the 25-26 school year.

Discussed the reconfiguration of schools survey data from the certified staff. Discussed the placement of cameras in each classroom.

Approved BOE policy 3012 update, stating that after accumulating 10 unpaid for meals, an alternative meal will be served.

Approved BOE policy 5045 update, eliminating technology convenience fee, which allowed students to take home their tech device. All students will now be allowed to take their device home. Students will still be charged for any damages to their device.

Approved BOE policy 5004 update, defining our elementary school as K-4, our middle as 5-8, and our high school as 9-12 for coding purposes with the State of Nebraska.

The Juniors are down one more test and they have received their results for the PSAT/NMSQT.


Many of the Seniors have applied, visited, and have been accepted by colleges. They have been sent many scholarship opportunities and have been filling those out as well!

Pursuant to laws and notices posted at Bruning-Davenport Schools, Cornerstone Bank, Bruning Bank, Bruning Post Office, Davenport Post Office, and also published in The Hebron Journal-Register on November 6, 2024; all proceedings were taken while the meeting was open to the public.

President Jerry Baysinger called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM. Unified members present were Jamie Koch, Sarah Krehnke, Ryan Miller, Sheri Norder, and Brad Williams. Local board members present were Jeff Hoins, Pat Kowalski, and Ryne Philippi. Superintendent Kelly Lampe, Principal Ruth Kowalski, Principal JJ Wagner, Erika Brinegar, Baxter Beals, Beth Dolnicek, Cammie Freitag, Logan Paup, Lon Schoenholz, Brooke Soukup, Trey Strong, and Leah Werner were also present.

President Baysinger welcomed all guests and recognized the Open Meetings Act.

The Consent Agenda included the agenda, October 14, 2024, Unified Board meeting minutes, Treasurer's Report, and the November claims. Brad Williams moved, seconded by Jamie Koch to approve the Consent Agenda as presented. (Roll call vote -6-0)

President Baysinger reported on having follow-up meetings about the Feasibility Study and it is time to start the Superintendent evaluation. He wanted to recognize the passing of James Manes and his service to the school board. He served well.

Principal Wagner reported on the following – Author/Illustrator Bruce Arant visited the school – Various staff attended LETRS and STEPS Training at the ESU – The Elementary and JH Quiz Bowl teams started their season

Principal Kowalski reported on the following – Bri Miller from Centerpointe presented about their services for mental health and substance abuse during Red Ribbon Week – FFA members attended the National Convention in Indianapolis – Congratulations to the Volleyball team for the 3<sup>rd</sup> place finish at state and a successful season – One-Act will be performing for the school on November 19<sup>th</sup> and has CRC on November 20<sup>th</sup> – Grandparents day is November 22 in Davenport – Combined Christmas concert in Davenport on December 10<sup>th</sup>

Superintendent Lampe reported on the following items: Daycare is in good financial standing – District is looking at adding Long-Term and/or Short-Term disability plans – waiting on a time for the December Board Meeting – Health/Dental insurance is up 5.49% next school year – Upper of 90% of Certified Staff says we should reconfigure our school buildings
