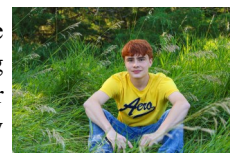

HIGH SCHOOL SPEECH: As the school year comes to a close, so did the 2025 Speech season. This season, we had a team of 15 students participating in 13 different events. These students attended seven different meets from January to March persuading, entertaining, informing (and more) their judges time after time. We also had several members place 4th or 5th, just narrowly missing the qualification mark. Our 5 qualifying girls competed at the State Competition at Kearney High School on March 28th. The OID ultimately ended up in 7th place, missing the mark for finals by ONE place! Eva ended up in 8th place for Persuasive, also barely missing finals. Although no one finished, it was a great day performing at State and we couldn’t be prouder of our students.

The coaches are so proud of all of these kids and want to thank them for all of their hard work this season! A special thank you goes to our seniors, Karolyn Ozenbaugh, Addison Brase, Maia Oltmans, Lexi Enghauser, and Esther Cowart for their time and dedication to the speech program. These five girls will be SO missed next year, but we are excited to continue building the speech program with the next group of students!

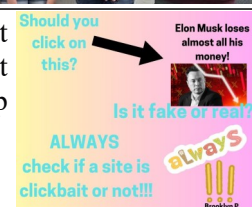
